

Dear Brethren,

This month, a contingent of representatives from our lodge went to do a dinner service at the Los Angeles Midnight Mission. For those not familiar with the organization, the Midnight Mission is a food bank, rehab center, and transitional housing facility on Skid Row in downtown Los Angeles. Started by Masons over a hundred years ago, the Midnight Mission offers food and other forms of assistance to those that the bulk of society often entirely dismisses or refuses to see or interact with.

On Sunday, March 16 th, 8 individuals from our Lodge, including prospects, partners, and brothers, showed up at 3:00 in the afternoon to first help prepare and then serve around 450 hungry individuals. It was fast paced, exhausting, and utterly rewarding work, and I fully intend to schedule another such service later this year. I believe that everyone should go there at least once, if only to see the contrast between the blocks surrounding the place and a mere two or three blocks away, where desperation gives way to privilege and tagged, dirty, old and worn buildings give way to pristine high rises and upscale eateries and amenities. Two blocks in any direction and the entire world seems to change.

As many of you know, I'm currently working on a master's degree in clinical psychology, with a focus on trauma studies. I am, in fact, about to enter my final quarter of that program. As part of my training, I am working at the westside Exodus Recovery Crisis Residential Treatment Programs (CRTP), where many of the same kinds of individuals I saw at the Midnight Mission come through the doors, after having been put on 5150 psychiatric holds for one reason or another. What continues to shock me, even after working there for over two months now, is just how varied the clients are in their backgrounds. Some have barely a middle-school education, having dropped out of school early because of the need to work, take care of family, or because of substance use issues. Others have multiple graduate degrees and were brought low by the onset of mental illness or (again) substance use problems. What strikes me is that they represent a cross-section of the full breadth of society – just as we ourselves do.

In other words, to paraphrase a fairly famous sentiment, there but for the grace of the Great Architect go each one of us. It is easy to drive past a homeless encampment, see the accumulated trash and judge the inhabitants for being filthy. It is conditioned from an early age in our society to judge the unclean, the different, and the poor as somehow "lesser", no matter how much lip service we pay the matter of poverty or equality in our houses of worship, our homes, schools, or even our Lodges. It is quite another thing to look them in the eye and see the hopelessness of one on whom most of society has given up. For many, their eyes hold the shadow of knowledge that they are likely beyond help – not because of their own choices, necessarily, but because by and large, society has forgotten them – or chosen to ignore them.

During the dinner service, one of our prospects handed one of the people in line their food with a sincere and well meaning, "Here you go, sir." My mother, who was among our group for the dinner service, related to me the homeless man's response (I was at the far end of the serving line and didn't witness the interaction directly). According to her, the man paused, looked our prospect in the eye, and said, "It's been a really long time since anyone called me

Such a simple, small thing; being treated with the tiniest shred of dignity, but for that individual in that moment, it meant so much more than one might think. I find the same true at my clinical training site. By and large, they are ordinary people who, because of poor choices or bad luck in the form of genetics, trauma, or lack of access to proper care, fell through the cracks

of society, and are thus judged for needing help. Or perhaps, it is for the more unforgivable crime of making those who see them feel uncomfortable, because deep down they know that there, but for grace or luck or circumstance, is the very picture of what their own life might have looked like.

The motto of the Midnight Mission is "Step Into the Light" – a fitting and highly Masonic sentiment that is entirely in line with both its purpose and its origins. As we enter a new Spring season, and approach holidays of Easter and Passover, so deeply associated with Freedom, Rebirth, and Renewal, let us not forget those who have been less fortunate than we. At the Passover Seder, we open our doors, uncover the plate of Matzah and proclaim, "Let all who are hungry come and eat." I pray that we all take care that such not be mere empty words, said by rote, but paired with meaningful and directed action in the year(s) ahead.

There was one other interaction my mother felt worth telling me about. She spoke of a relatively clean-cut, young-looking man, likely in his late teens or early twenties by her guess. He told her it was his first day on the streets, and he didn't know what to do. "Get some food," she told him, "Then talk to the men wearing staff shirts and ask for help. This is a place that Masons built. They'll help you."

May the places Masons build always be deserving of coming so well recommended. I urge you to come and help us make our Lodge so – now and in the future.

Think About It – Ron Koretz, P.M. Think About It

Most of you probably have the same problem that I do, namely the inordinate amount of spam that arrives each day via email. For some time this past fall, I was receiving almost daily emails of suggested recipes from a website containing the word "cookingdaily". At the same time, I was also receiving similar emails allegedly from other sites that were also claiming to provide cooking tips. All of these emails were arriving in my spam folder and contained a "View Recipe" link. These were of little interest to me and I never opened those links. In addition, all of these emails were accompanied by a very similar option at the bottom to unsubscribe, and one day I thought that I would try to get rid of these emails by requesting to be unsubscribed. While no cessation of emails occurred after my first two or three tries, I seemed to have been successful after yet another effort, as I received a very curious message informing me that emails were not being sent to my email address.

I initially found it amusing that a website which was supposedly not sending me emails did not seem to appreciate that I was responding to an email that it sent. My thought was that its artificial intelligence, if it even existed, was not programmed to recognize this conundrum and only reported that I was not on the mailing list, meaning that I had successfully unsubscribed already. In fact, the emails then did cease.

I kept a copy of that email, hoping to use it in one of these columns. This month, I decided to use the story and, out of curiosity, googled "cookingdaily website". That effort turned up a comment from August 2024 by some person named "catholiver". He or she was also receiving what appeared to be spam from alleged cooking websites including "Cooking Daily". In the subsequent series of postings, other people stated that they had not heard of the website and all agreed that some type of spamming was occurring.

Upon trying other variants in an effort to find out what cookingdaily represented, I ultimately came across some commentary from the Delta Community Credit Union that was dated June 16, 2021. It was entitled "Don't click 'Unsubscribe' from spam emails and texts", and suggested that one should just delete it and tag it as spam or block the sender. While most unsubscribe options are part of marketing programs and are legitimate, apparently some spammers want that link selected because it shows that the email account is valid and active. In fact, the link could even take one to a fake site that could result in more serious consequences. It has been almost three months since I clicked that unsubscribe button and, to the best of my knowledge, I have not suffered any adversities as a result. However, I have now been warned that the next time I want to click on a link, I should follow my own advice and...

HOW TO GET YOUR DUES CARD

With the installation of the iMember 2.0 online system a few years ago that all brothers can access upon registration, lodge secretaries no longer receive all the dues cards to mail out after payment.

The dues card is now online and can be printed or downloaded in an $8 \frac{1}{2} \times 11$ format which can be printed or downloaded to a phone.

- 2. Send an email to our lodge Secretary Mike Bear PM (michael.bear@mac.com) requesting that it be mailed to you.
